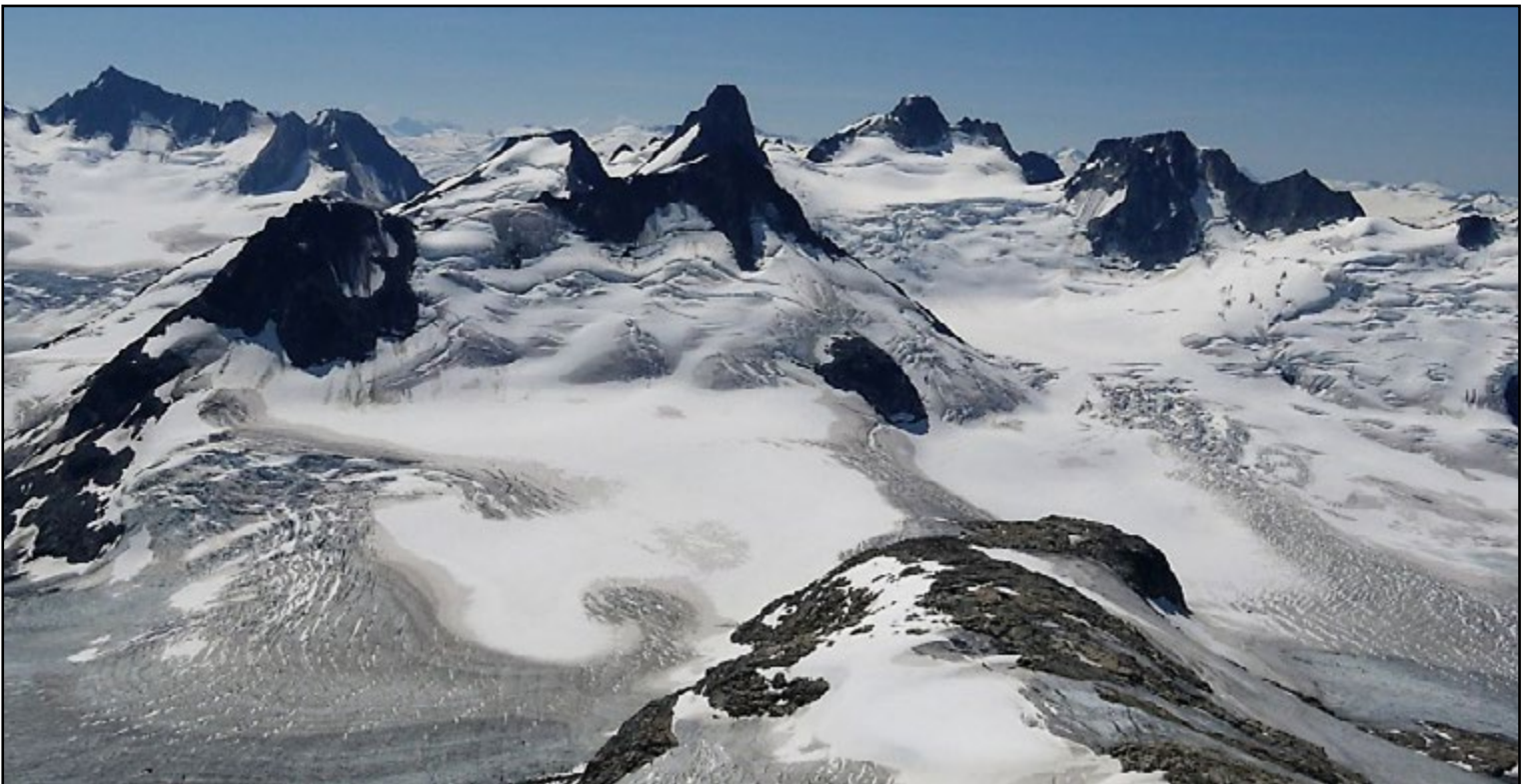

### **Access denied**

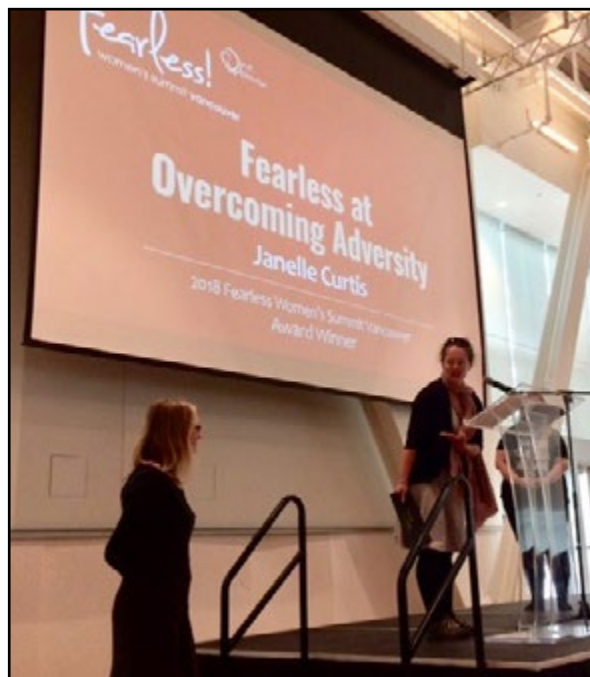
If only it was just a computer glitch. But sadly we know that the restrictions on access to the backcountry and provincial parks on the Island by private landowners are causing enduring problems. As frustrations rise, it seems the issue has at least been heard by some politicians. We were pleased that MLA Scott Fraser (mid Island-Pacific rim) called a private meeting last week to meet with representatives of affected organisations including ACC-VI, in the hope of working to find possible solutions. Unfortunately, our plans to be there were derailed by dangerous driving conditions, so our contributions had to be made through others. Nonetheless, preparing for the meeting has strengthened our network and given us a channel for ongoing communication. We will discuss how best to capitalise on this and will report back to the membership on next steps.

Congratulations to Janelle Curtis who was a 2018 Fearless Women's Summit Vancouver Award Winner. Nominated by our very own Vivian Addison, Janelle's award "fearless in overcoming adversity", reflects the extraordinary journey she has taken in her recovery from her serious injuries following a fall in Strathcona Park in July 2016. In Vivian's words:

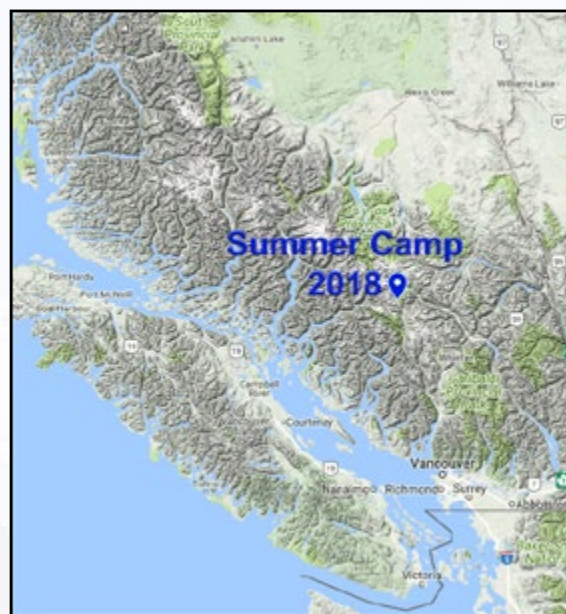

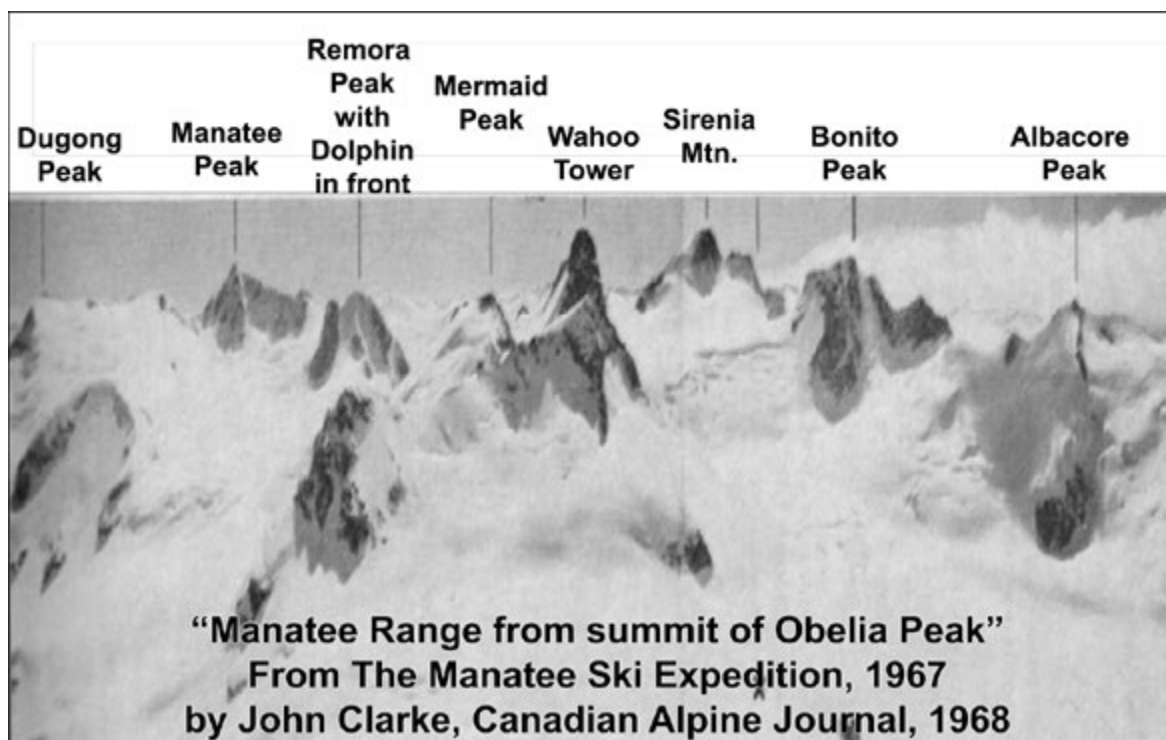
